1 → Luke 3:23-38

God loves His people with (Hesed) a never stopping, never giving up, unbreaking, always and forever love from one generation to the next. This kind of unconditional love, a covenant, is continually alluded to in Jesus' genealogy.

✓ Consider these covenants, and the God of these covenants:

- 1 How is God keeping or fulfilling or, how did He fulfill each one?
- 2 How can we keep this in the forefront of our thinking as the world around us lives in turmoil?
- 3 There's been an increasing amount of conversation about hate. Interestingly, this seems to be happening more in the world around us, than it is among the church who is us. What do the/these promises of God tell us about hope in the face of hate?
- 2 -> The Covenant with David. In verse 31 is King David. The unconditional covenant is in 2 Samuel 7:4-17 and 1 Chronicles 17:4-15.
- 3 → The Covenant with Abraham. Verse 34 mentions Abraham. The covenant is in Genesis 12:1-3; 15:1-7.
- **4** → The Covenant with Noah. In verse 36 we find Noah. God covenanted with (promised) Noah after the universal flood that destroyed the world In Genesis 9:8-17.
- 5 → The Covenant with Adam. Verse 38 goes back to Adam. The Adamic Covenant is found in Genesis 3:15-
- **6** → The New Covenant. Verse 38, "the son of Enos, the son of Seth, the son of Adam, the son of God." This is, perhaps, the central point of this genealogy in that it begins (not ends) with God.
