1 → Read: Luke 8:26-39

What, perhaps, are molehills in this story?
What, perhaps, are mountains in this story?
Who is the Mountain in this story? (Everyone should get this right!)

2 → <u>Read:</u> 1 John 4:4 You, dear children, are from God and have overcome them, because the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world.

Describe what this means (1) spiritually AND (2) practically. Give examples.

3 → <u>Read:</u> Hebrews 12:1-2 ¹ Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. ² Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

This keeps coming up. Why do you think it's important?

Deeper Dive:

4 → Read: James 4:7 Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

Submit and resist: One is positive, one is negative. One is to God, one is against the adversary. Deeper than those observations, <u>discuss the difference in the nature of submitting to a God Who inhabits you by His Spirit, and resisting one who wants to control God.</u>

5 → <u>Read:</u> John 10:10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

How does this affect 4?
